Take a small amount of bait and place it about 4 to 6 inches in front of the trap, then a small amount just inside of the door, then small amounts creating a trail to just behind the trip pan where the rest of the food is placed. Balting techniques will vary depending on the animal being trapped.
	To release an unwanted catch from the Tru-Catch trap, gently roll the trap over onto its top. The door will automatically open for release.
